THE STORY

On September 11 we will start The Story. The Story is your opportunity to encounter God in his Word like never before. The Story is a collection of the basic stories of the Bible that tell the

The Story will take you into God's house where he has framed photos of your ancestors—folks you may not know—lining the walls of his house.

Yet who he wants most of all for you to meet in his story is his son. He desires for you to look long into the loving eyes of Jesus Christ and hear his claims—that what he began in the first chapter of creation he will realize at the last chapter of the New Creation, where a perfect people can live in a perfect place with their perfect Lord.

You may be a bit intimidated by the Bible. You're not alone; many people are. And no wonder, its pages mention odd names like Jehoshaphat and Nebuchadnezzar. It contains accounts from places you probably never heard of, like Sinai and Samaria. And it seems to be made up of a lot of different, seemingly unrelated stories. But it really is one big, exciting story.

Like last year, Sunday school classes for all age groups will study the same topic for that week. This topic will also be the theme of our worship service and my sermon.

I invite you and your family to join us each week as we study The Story together.

Men's Breakfast


The men's fellowship & devotion breakfast will continue this fall on the first and third

This year our church was chosen for the Chamber of Commerce's Christmas ornament. I am not sure of the price yet, but the ornament can be purchased during the Turkey Festival, or afterwards at the Chamber office or here at the Church. All proceeds go to support the Chamber. Below is the historical sketch of our Church which will appear in the Eldon Advertiser.

The Methodist Church had a presence in Miller County as early as 1833 with several circuit rider ministers preaching in homes, schoolhouses, or under trees in the towns of Pleasant Mount (now Mount Pleasant), Eldon, Olean, and High point.

The first official Methodist Church was organized in Eldon in 1882. The Methodists met one Sunday per month in a Church building that was also used by the Congregation Church and the Disciples Church.

The first Methodist Church built in Eldon was in 1889 at the Corner of Oak and North Streets, but was destroyed only 6 years later by cyclonic winds. The Church was rebuilt in 1897 and underwent several remodels and additions as the Methodists worshipped there until they outgrew the church in 1963.

In 1963 they built a new church on the corner of Oak and Fairview. This is the current Church. Rev. Harold Dodds was the pastor at the time. This new church was built by Joe Curtiss and the Curtiss-Manes Construction Company of Eldon, which is now Curtiss Manes Shulte Inc..

In 1968 the Methodist Church merged with the Evangelical United Brethren Church to form the United Methodist Church. Rev. Steve George is the current pastor and has been serving here since 2012.
